Masonic ritual offers lessons for decision-making.

The sixth degree, Confidential Secretary, reinforces a lesson from the Blue Lodge that we should subdue our passions and make decisions unemotionally. The legend of the 6th degree derives from two isolated sentences found in 1st Kings of the Volume of Sacred Law:

"But when Hiram came out from Tyre to see the cities which Solomon had given him, they did not please him. Therefore, he said, what kind of cities are these that you have given me, my brother?"

In our legend Hiram angrily confronts Solomon over the condition of these cities. Zabud, Solomon's trusted assistant, was hiding in the chamber observing the argument. Zabud is drawn into the confrontation and narrowly escapes punishment only by Solomon's intervention.

A salient message of this degree is never to make a decision emotionally. Hiram made a decision from anger, Zabud decided to hide out of fear.

The 15th degree, Knight of the East, teaches that

decisions should be based on principle and "rightness".

Our protagonist, Zerubbabel, requests King Cyrus to free the Jews from captivity so they can rebuild the Temple. Cyrus requires Zerubbabel to break a vow of secrecy in exchange for his people's freedom and offers him inducements to do so.

Zerubbabel refuses. He keeps his vow of secrecy. His decision was unemotional. It was based on the "rightness" of a duty to keep a vow or promise.

In the 28th degree, Knight Commander of the Temple, Constance likewise takes a solemn vow. Similar inducements are offered to break it. He stands firm and unemotional. But ultimately, he breaks his vow in order defend his city against attack. His decision was based on a desired outcome. Constance unemotionally decided the defense of the city had greater benefit than maintaining his vow.

The choices Constance and Zerubbabel confronted were similar, but Zerubbabel keeps his vow, Constance breaks his. Masonry honors both as heroes.

Zerubbabel and Constance were Confidential Secretaries and knew the lesson of the 6th degree. Both made their decisions unemotionally. Both dispassionate demonstrated disinterestedness. rational thinking, a nobility of character and any number of virtues Freemasonry advocates.

Zerubbabel's decision was based on principle. Constance's decision was based on an expected beneficial outcome. The reasons for the decisions were different. The decisions were different. Which was "right?"

Clearly, we should make choices dispassionately. But when do we decide based on principle and when based on an expected outcome?

Freemasonry highlights this ethical dilemma but furnishes no help on how to choose.

The British philosopher WD Ross (1877-1971) provides some help. He asserts that both outcomes and principles are relevant to whether an act is right or good or moral. Our decision "depends on all the morally significant" issues.

"No act is ever, [by] virtue of falling under some general

category, necessarily [or] actually right; its rightness depends on its whole nature." For example, the prime facie rightness of a benevolent act may outweigh the prima facie wrongness of breaking a promise.

Ross skillfully avoids moral relativism, as does Freemasonry. He opines that "we have no better way" of knowing right and wrong than "looking to the moral convictions of the best people of many generations, who have developed an extremely delicate appreciation of moral distinctions."

That sounds like Freemasonry. We look to the "moral convictions of the best people of many generation who have developed an extremely delicate appreciation of moral distinctions."

We seek to emulate the sages. See you in Lodge.



Shriners International

- 🔼 In 2022, the Shriners International fraternity and the Shriners Hospitals for Children health care system celebrate major milestones.
- 🔼 Shriners International is celebrating the 150th anniversary of its founding, which was on September 26, 1872.
- 🔼 Shriners Hospitals for Children is celebrating the 100th anniversary of its founding, on September 16, 1922.
- Shriners International was founded in New York City in 1872 by a group of fun-loving Masons. Master Masons are eligible for membership in the organization, which is based on the fundamentals of Masonry but with the added elements of fun and fellowship.
- 🙇 Created by Walter M. Fleming, M.D., and actor William J. "Billy" Florence using a Near-east theme that was in vogue at the time, the fraternity was originally named the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine. It still uses Near-eastern symbols, most distinctively the red fez.
- 🔼 Now known as Shriners International, the fraternity has nearly 200,000 members, and Shriners can be found on six continents. Shriners are known for their good humor, and they love spending time with others who share their interests, whether it be performing in parades or bands, connecting via Zoom for a technology unit or getting together to ride motorcycles, make barbecue or craft beer. The bond of brotherhood that Shriners enjoy also helps them develop personal and professional skills such as communications and leadership.
- 🙇 In addition to fun and fellowship, Shriners value serving their communities in ways large and small. From hosting charity events to volunteering their time to supporting their official philanthropy, the red-fezzed Shriners are among the most generous and caring men you will ever meet.

Shriners Hospitals for Children

- Members of Shriners International have always shared a common desire to help those in need. Even in the earliest years of the fraternity, nobles aided victims of catastrophic events and served those less fortunate in their local communities, exhibiting a generous spirit beyond the group's mission of fun and fellowship.
- 👔 In the late 1910s, Shriners International took steps to formalize a philanthropic endeavor members could call their own. In 1922, the first Shriners Hospitals for Children opened, in Shreveport, Louisiana, to serve children with orthopedic conditions, particularly those caused by the polio epidemic happening at the time.
- 🕝 What began as a single hospital is now a unique health care system with locations across the United States, as well as in Mexico and Canada. Outreach programs help the system reach children around the world.
- 👔 Today, the health care system, often known as Shriners Children's, offers care for a range of orthopedic issues, as well as care for burn injuries, craniofacial conditions, spine care and spinal cord injuries, colorectal and gastrointestinal care, and sports medicine. Our experienced, innovative and dedicated teams work together to provide treatment to help each patient meet their goals and reach their full potential.
- Since 1922, Shriners Hospitals for Children has improved the lives of more than 1.5 million children.
- 👔 The health care system's three-part mission has one goal: to change and improve lives. We do this by caring for our patients, conducting research to gain knowledge and develop new treatments, and providing educational opportunities for physicians and other health care professionals.
